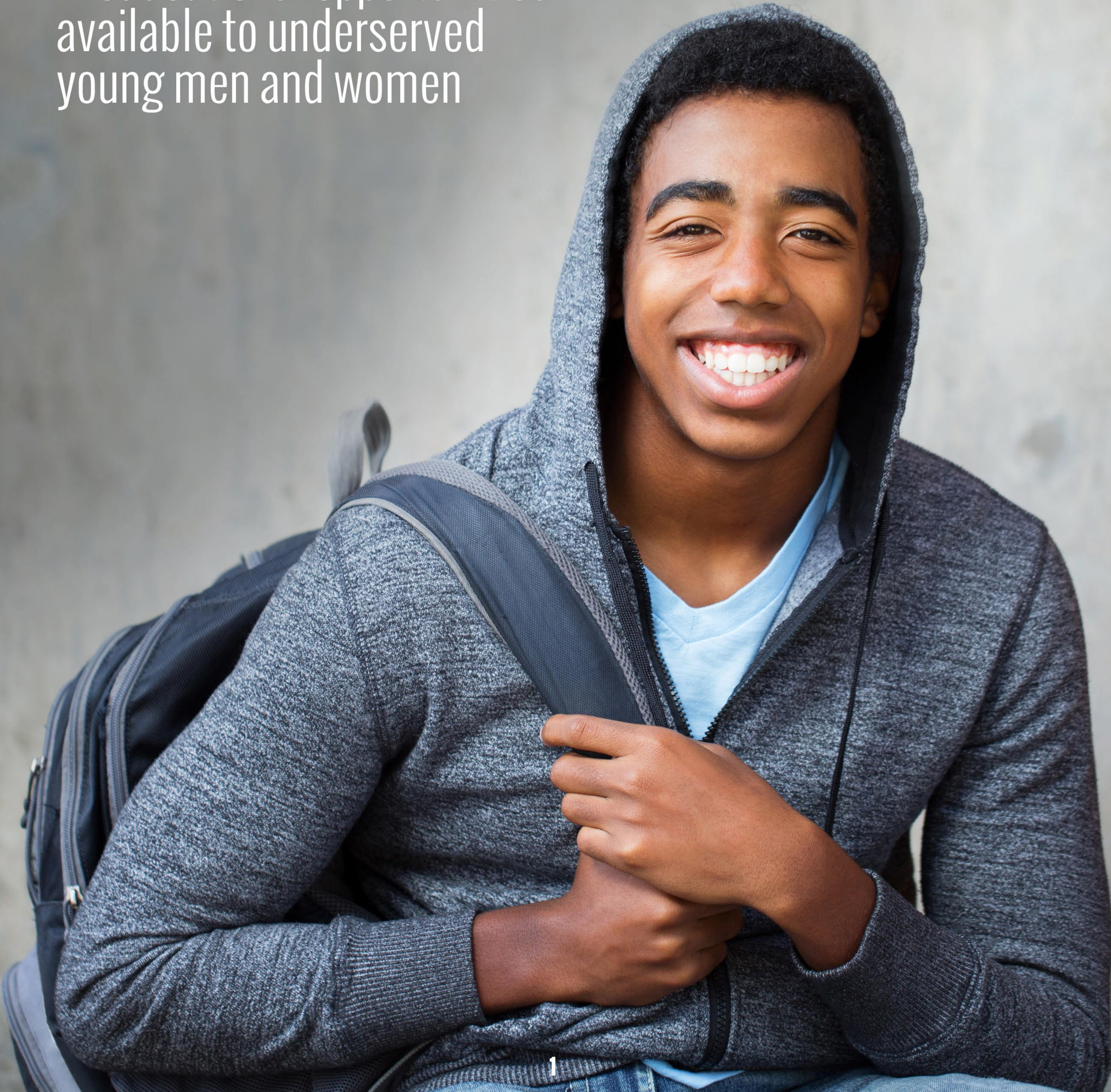

JSP HISTORY

THE JORDAN SCHOLARS PROGRAM ("JSP"), UNDER THE UMBRELLA OF JFF, WAS ORIGINALLY FOUNDED TO PROVIDE YOUNG MEN ACCESS TO A PRESTIGIOUS PRIVATE HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION.

These young men are generally from single parent families, many of whom are living below the poverty level and stuck in their current social/economic situation, with little hope for the opportunity others better positioned might be able to afford. Additionally, many come from neighborhoods with poor public education systems and without a strong academic foundation would have likely struggled to qualify for admissions at most top colleges and universities.

At its inception, all of the program's young men had a unique athletic talent for the sport of football and were identified through trusted relations with established well respected organized inner city youth programs. Candidates all demonstrated strong character, a great work ethic, and potential in academics and often other cocurricular activities. While some students admitted to The Jordan Scholars Program may not have initially possessed the academic foundation to be immediately successful in a rigorous academic community, they were willing and eager to participate in an intensive tutoring program. Every student was also provided with guidance, counseling, and mentoring – as well as the first-class tutoring service - to ensure their ability to qualify for college admission.

To date, the program has a 100% success rate. Every Jordan Scholar has graduated from high school and a vast majority went on to receive scholarships at some of the most prestigious colleges and universities in the nation (see page 10). These young men have thrived academically, socially, and in diverse areas of school life and community service. After 25 years, the foundation is thrilled about the future—while football will remain the key centerpiece of the program, the foundation plans to evolve going forward to include many more young people, including both female athletes and academic merit scholars. These young men and women are dedicated to the pursuit of excellence and despite how little many of them have, they are thrilled with the opportunity provided and thus, work to maintain a positive influence in the community.

The Jordan Scholars Program is structured as a program for life focused on character, accountability, and responsibility enabling each scholar to obtain a college degree and become meaningful participants in their respective communities. JSP has an active alumni club and an annual event to get together with their families and friends and to meet other Jordan Scholars. Many Alumni also provide mentoring to the current enrolled scholars and recent JSP college graduates.



THE JORDAN FAMILY FOUNDATION

THE JORDAN FAMILY FOUNDATION WAS ORIGINALLY FOUNDED IN 1994 THROUGH THE JORDAN SCHOLARS PROGRAM AT A PRESTIGIOUS PRIVATE HIGH SCHOOL IN BROOKLYN, NY.

The program moved to a school in New Jersey from 2016-2020 and has now moved to South Florida and partnered with Archbishop McCarthy High School. Archbishop McCarthy High School is a highly regarded co-educational college preparatory school in Southwest Ranches, FL. Through need-based scholarships, JFF is committed to helping young men and women, primarily from minority communities. JSP, under the umbrella of JFF, strives to provide opportunities for academic, athletic, and social enrichment to these underserved youth.

JFF HAS FUNDED FOUR-YEAR HIGH SCHOOL TUITIONS FOR **MORE THAN 120 DESERVING STUDENTS**, ALL OF WHOM HAVE GONE ON TO ATTEND FIRST-RATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES ACROSS THE COUNTRY.

Additionally, JFF provides resources to its partner school with funding for various special programs and capital improvement projects, including wellness center and science classroom upgrades.

The Jordan Family Foundation's mission revolves around helping underserved children thrive in life—not only as students, but also as productive members of their communities and society at large. This support continues after high school, throughout college and into adulthood, seeking to help them develop the self-confidence, character, work ethic, and life skills that will serve them well for the rest of their lives.



THE JORDAN SCHOLARS PROGRAM

THE JORDAN SCHOLARS PROGRAM SERVES AS JFF'S PRIMARY VEHICLE FOR ASSISTING UNDERPRIVILEGED YOUNG MEN AND WOMEN BY PROVIDING THEM WITH ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS TO AN ELITE HIGH SCHOOL.

Central to the mission are the concepts of diversity and inclusion. Helping those who need it most, particularly young minorities from marginalized socioeconomic communities, is paramount.

The partnership with Archbishop McCarthy is critical to the mission. JFF and Archbishop McCarthy share many of the same core values, namely the desire to develop “the whole student—mind, body, spirit, character.” The ultimate goal is to see all Jordan Scholars achieve a personal level of excellence in the areas of academics, teamwork, commitment,

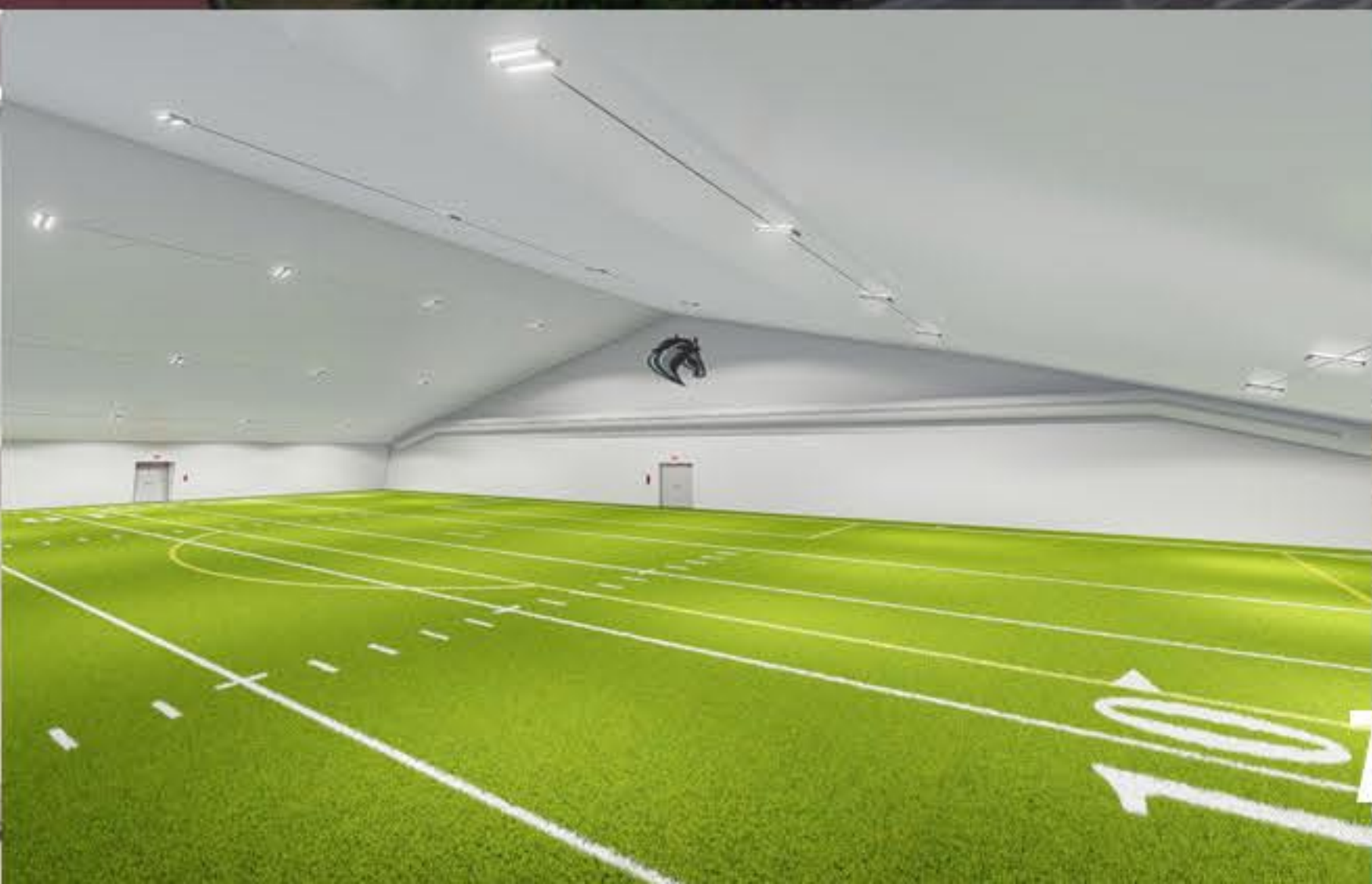
COMPLETE SUPPORT

JFF IS ALSO ACTIVELY ENGAGED IN SUPPORTING ENHANCEMENTS TO ARCHBISHOP MCCARTHY'S PHYSICAL CAMPUS.

Mangiero’s elite leadership skills drive the success of JFF through a focus on the whole child—striving to develop the mind, body, and character of all those under his tutelage.
